lose the Boats to Rugged So Ends
31 30 Lat Non Long non

Sunday Feb 3
Comes with Strong South Winds and
Dark Cloudy Weather Squally Sch heading
Whales on de front Tacks Under Short Sail
middle part the same latter part
headed N E Saw Whales heading N E
lost the Boats and got 3 small Whales
and cut them in So Ends
Lat 31.11 Long 44.35

Monday Feb 4
Comes with Strong E S E winds and
Clear Weather Sch heading to N E and
Working on the Bluecher latter part
started Bailing More Round to South
dark Cloudy Weather So Ends

Lat 29.28 Long 44.32

Tuesday February 5 1907
Comes with Strong E S E winds and
Cloudy Weather Sch heading to the South
and Bailing middle part got three
Boiling Stom oil down and headed S E
all sail out clear Weather So ends
Lat 31.02 Long 44.25

Wednesday Feb 6
Comes with light E S E winds and
Clear Weather Sch heading S E all sail
out at 7 P M tack to N E and took in
Sail middle and latter part Squally
and Strong E N E So ends
Lat 30.42 Long 44.21

Thursday Feb 7
Comes with Strong E N E winds and Squally
Weather Sch heading S E under Short
Sail middle and latter part Calm
Saw a Large Whale going S E lost the
Boats but lost Run of him So ends
Lat 31.00 Long 44.17

Friday Feb 8
Comes with light air and Calm Clear
middle part the same latter part
light air from West Sch headed South
all sail out So ends
Lat 31.25 Long 44.05

Saturday Feb 9
Comes with Calm and Clear Weather
middle part Calm latter part light
East Winds and Clear Weather Sch heading
to the North all sail out So ends
Lat 31.18 Long 44.07
