This day began with strong N.E. wind 4 Whalers in sight no Obs
Spoke a Swift

Wed May 22nd

This day began with light N.W. wind clear and pleasant W. A Groves and Allen Swift in sight

Lat 38-07

Long 71-30

Thurs May 23rd

This day began with strong S.W. wind rain heavy sea seen Whales did not lower no Obs.

Fri May 24th

the day began with N.E. wind rain raised Mate one Whales at 4 P.M. boat struck no Obs.

Sat May 25th

This day began with strong S.E. wind cut 41 Whale in and start the fire Lat 37-50
Long 70-20

Sun May 26th

This day began with strong S.E. wind at 7 A.M. raised Whales got 2 cutting one and one parted the chain ^{lost the Whales} so this ends the day

Mon May 27th

This day began with gale wind from S.W. heavy rain put out fire

Tues May 28th

This day began with strong N.W. wind steering S.E. under the try sails finish boiling and stood down Lat 37-30
Long 69-00

Wed May 29th

This day began with heavy N.W. gale steering E.S.E. under reef try sails

Lat 36-43

Long 66-30

Thurs May 30th

This day began with N.W. gale still under reef try sails steering S.E.

Lat 36-30

Long 65-00

This day began with moderate gale steering S.S.E. seen one sail Lat 35-30
