

Journal of a voyage kept on board the
 Thursday Oct the 16 1834
 Commenced with fresh breeze raining off
 for whale at 2 PM towards three boats the
 starboard boat struck the whales brought
 two the larboard and waist boats got fast
 at 5 PM took three whales along side and
 got ready for cutting at daylight commencing
 and saw a whale close to the ship at 11 PM
 finished cutting and saw a sail a stern

Friday Oct the 17
 Commenced with all hands employed in
 cutting up junk and clearing up the
 decks at 4 PM made all sail at daylight
 commenced boiling at 8 AM tacking
 tacked ship and stood to the eastward

Saturday Oct the 18 1834
 this day commenced with fresh breeze
 and pleasant weather with the watch
 employed in boiling middle part
 squally and light showers of rain
 at 3 PM finished boiling and cleared
 up the decks so ends these 24 hours
 with pleasant weather

Sunday Oct the 19
 this day commenced with fine breeze and
 pleasant weather with the watch
 employed in various jobs middle part
 squally with light showers of rain
 standing to the eastward with our
 starboard tacks on board

Monday Oct the 20
 Commenced with light winds and squally
 with rain at 8 AM commenced storing
 down ~~the ship and cleared~~
~~the ship and cleared~~
 with the wind light
 we shearing to the eastward this ends
 these 24 hours with pleasant weather

Ship Galen Bount to the East Cape

Thursday Oct the 24 1834
 Commenced with pleasant weather and
 all hands employed in storing down
 at 4 PM finished and cleared up the
 decks and brook on the fore hole
 middle part light winds at 8 AM
 tacked ship and stood to the eastward

Wednesday Oct the 25
 Commenced with light winds and
 pleasant weather with the watch
 employed in various jobs middle
 part more moderate this ends these
 24 hours with pleasant weather

Thursday Oct the 26
 this day commenced with pleasant
 weather at 2 PM saw a school of large
 blackfish middle part moderate the
 wind very light at 7 AM saw a sail
 to the leeward Running before the wind

Friday Oct the 27
 Commenced with a fine breeze and pleasant
 weather with the watch employed in
 various jobs middle part fresh breeze
 and (Monday) at 11 AM got an
 observation and found we was 35 miles
 to the northward of the line

Saturday Oct the 28
 Commenced with fresh breeze and
 cloudy with the watch employed
 in ships duty this ends these 24 hours
 with pleasant weather

Sunday Oct the 29
 Commenced with pleasant weather
 at 2 PM saw a school of grampuses
 middle part wind very light latter
 part breeze fresh from the south
 at 12 AM tacked ship and stood
 to the eastward so ends these 24 hours
