Commenced with light wind and pleasant weather. At 6 PM loward did not get fast latter part fresh breeze and foggy at 11 AM loward did not get fast whales very - wild

Thursday Dec the 4
lat Obs 35.45
long in 21
Commenced with fresh wind at 2 PM loward did not get fast at 4 PM spoke the Herald West Fairhaven 400 middle part fresh wind rainy at 11 AM moderated made sail

Friday Dec the 5
lat Obs 35.45
long in 23
Commenced with fresh wind with the watch employed in Chagging one at 6 PM spoke the Washington of Sagharbour with 800 at 10 AM loward did not get fast. At 10 AM parted the outer bob stay

Saturday Dec the 6
lat Obs 36.23
long in 23
Commenced with fresh wind and pleasant weather at 3 PM loward did not get fast at daylight made sail at 4 AM blowing fresh took sail and hove two

Sunday Dec the 7
lat Obs 35.00
long in 30
Commenced with fresh winds middle part moderate at daylight made sail and loward did not get fast spoke the Joseph Sparfield

Monday Dec the 8
lat Obs 35.20
long in 31
Commenced with pleasant weath and gaming with Joseph Sparfield and Garrison. at 14 months with 900 at 7 PM came on board took in sail at 11 AM hove aback for the french ship Niles to run down

Thursday Dec the 9 1834
lat Obs 36.21
long in 41
Commenced with pleasant weather and light winds at 5 PM Capt Smith from the ship Niles came on board two months from Harox with 600 barrels at sunset a boat came on board and had some affick latter part fine breeze steering SW

Wednesday Dec the 10
lat Obs 36.40
long in 41
Commenced with pleasant weather at 4 PM loward did not get fast at sunset took in sail at 8 AM spoke the Flora of New London with 1200 we then hauled our wind to the Eastward with a fine breeze from the North

Thursday Dec the 11
lat Obs 36.58
long in 34 miles East
Commenced with fresh breeze at 10 AM spoke the Atlantick of Bridgeport with 600 latter part fresh breezes

Friday Dec the 12
lat Obs 35.40
long in 46
Commenced with fresh wind at 3 PM spoke the Columbus of Fairhaven 800 spinn 200 whale the Triton of Portsmouth with 800 whale oil latter part moderate made all sail

Saturday Dec the 13
lat Obs 35.22
long in 40
Commenced with light winds and pleasant weather at 6 PM spoke the Grand Turk of New Bedford latter part Calm wind at the main top sail

Sunday Dec the 14
lat Obs 35.19
long in 46
Commenced with calm middle part light breeze from the north at 6 AM spoke the John of New London 1900 so ends this 24 hours
