Monday Dec the 15 1834
lat Obs 35.10
long in 8.10E
Commences with light wind and
pleasant weather at 3PM spoke the
Herald of New Bedford 300
so end there at hours with fine weather

Thursday Dec the 16
lat Obs 35.26
long in 10.00E
Commences with fine weather at 1PM
spoke the Gold Hunter Fall River 1800
at 3PM spoke the Fama Bristol 900
middle part breeze latter part rainey
and fresh breeze from the SW

Wednesday Dec the 17
lat Obs 34.45
long in 15.57
Commences with fresh wind and
cloudy at 6 PM reefed topsails
middle part moderated latter part
made sail with the wind SW

Thursday Dec the 18
lat Obs 34.41
long in 16.56
Commences with fresh wind and
cloudy with the watch employed
in various jobs at 7 PM reefed
topsails middle part moderate
made sail 11 AM got the starboard
Anchor on the bow

Friday Dec the 19
lat Obs 34.11
long in 18.05
Commences with fresh wind
with the watch employed in
getting the larboard anchor
on the belt middle part took in
sail at 12PM stood to the westward
at 3PM tacked ship stood to the
East ward at 12PM saw the land
on the Cape of Good Hope

Saturday Dec the 20
lat Obs 34.00
long in 18.56
Commences with fresh gales
steering in for the land at 4 PM
tacked ship and stood off middle
part fresh latter part moderated
made sail and stood in for the land

Continued
Sunday Dec the 21 1834
Commences with fresh wind at 2 AM
saw the land at 10 AM got the Anchor
off the bow the wind forcey at 12 AM
Carved away the foretop sail yard in
the sling took in sail come to an
Anchor in 15 fathoms of water

Monday Dec the 22
Commences with fresh gales at 3PM sent
down the foretop sail yard and topgalant
yards and mast blowing very fresh middle
part moderate at daylight hove up
and stood in for the land town at 8 AM
let go anchor in 6 fathoms at 10 AM the
Doctor came on board at 11 AM the Capt
went on shore and sent off a fresh message

Thursday Dec the 23
Commences with fine weather with
11 hands employed in clearing up the
decks at 2 PM lieutenant from an English
Sloop of war came on board latter
part the Starboard watch went on shore

Friday Wednesday Dec the 24
this day we lay to anchor in the
harbor of Cape town with fine weather
the Starboard watch on shore
liberty for 24 hours

Thursday Dec the 25
this day the Starboard watch a shore
on liberty sent up the fore top sail yard
and bent the topsail fine weather and
light winds from the NW

Friday Dec the 26
Commences with fine weather
at 8 AM the larboard watch went
on shore on liberty the Starboard
watch employed in sending up the
mainmast and Mizen topgalant
