Dec Saturday Dec the 27 1834
Commences with all hands Employed
in sending up the fore topgalmast
and topgalant yards getting the ship ready
for sea at 10 PM took on board 12 bushels of
potatoes and two sheep

Sunday Dec the 28
at Daylight sent two men on shore
that we brought from the Cape De Verd
Islands at 10 Am we up our Anchor
and went to sea having all hands on
board 24 in Number so ends these 24 with
a baffling wind.

Monday Dec the 29
this Day commences with fresh wind
all hands employed in stowing the Anchors
at 3 PM Doubled Reaped topsails at 5 PM
the Lions Runge bore SE by E Dist 6 leagues
Lat Ob from where I take my departure with
34.19 the wind strong from the SW
long in middle part Set the mainsail latter
part freshens hauled SE

Thursday Dec the 30
Lat Ob Commences with fresh wind under close reefed
35.19 topsails middle part freshens at 8 Am sent in
long in the flying jib boom latter part quite
15.55 moderate made sail Stearing SW

Wednesday Dec the 31 1834
Lat Ob Commences with moderate weather Middle
part light wind at 6 Am Killed a
congoon sheep at 10 Am the wind hauled SW
35.31 we then used ship stood to the SE

Thursday Dec January the 1 1835
Lat Ob Commences with light wind at 9 PM brewed up
36.56 strong took in the topgalant sail at 9 PM
lacked ship stood to the Westward at 6 ten
36.15 lacked ship stood to the SE at 12 Am
for our new years Dinner we had the hind
Quarter of a Cape town Ram

Friday January the 2 1835
Commences with fresh wind middle
part freshens from the West at 6 Am
doubled reefed topsails latter part shudding
under close Reaped main topsail and
Fore Sail Wind West Course SE by E

Saturday January the 3 1835
Commences with strong gale from the
west shudding under close reefed
main topsail and fore sail at 4 PM
judged the Cape to be at the
latter part moderated set the fore and
Mizen topsails

Sunday January the 4
Commences with fresh wind steering
SE middle part moderated Made sail
at 6 Am unbent the main topsail
and sent another latter part quite
Moderate made all sail

Monday Jan the 5
Commences with light wind and pleasant
weather at 3 PM spoke the Main North
Fairhaven 1200 bbls whale oil latter part
breeze from the East so ends these 24 hours

Thursday Jan the 6
Commences with light wind and pleasant
weather with all hands Employed in
various jobs middle part freshens from
the NE latter part the wind moderates
Steering ENE so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday Jan the 7
Commences with strong breeze from the
SW middle part calm at 3 Am light
breeze from the SW latter part calm
with the watch Employed in
mending sails
