

From Cape Town to

Thursday Jan the 8 1835
Commenced with light wind and pleasant weather the wind NW comm. B & C
middle part doubled Reaped topsails at Daylight. Moderated Made all sail at 5 AM saw a Spout so ends these 24 hours

Friday Jan the 9
Commenced with light wind and pleasant weather Middle part Calm at daylight boreed up for the NE latter part freshens took in the top & allant Sails so ends these 24 hours Stearing E by S

Saturday Jan the 10
Commences with light wind and pleasant weather with the watch Employed in Repairing Sails Middle part freshens took in sail at 4 AM the wind shifted W & S W with a fine Shower of rain Course NE so ends this 24 hours

Sunday Jan the 11
Commences with Strong breeze from the SW with the watch employed in Repairing Sails Middle part moderate latter part saw a sail standing to the Northward and westward

Monday Jan the 12
Commences with pleasant gales and fine weather at Midnight saw two ships standing to the Westward latter part more moderate so ends these 24 hours with the watch employed in mending sails

Tuesday Jan the 13
Commences with fresh wind with the watch Employed in Repairing sails at 6 PM took in the fore and allant topsails at daylight set them latter part freshens took in the fore and mizen topsails

The Mosambique Passage

Wednesday Jan the 14 1835
Commences with fresh gales the ship laying two under Close Reaped Main topsail and foresail Middle part light squalls of rain with wind so ends these 24 hours with fresh gales

Thursday Jan the 15
Commences with heavy gales from the SE Middle part Squally with rain at 8 AM the watch Employed in mending sails - commenced raining so we gave it up for a bad job

Friday Jan the 16
Commenced with heavy gale of wind with squally of rain at 11 AM wore ship and stood to the Southward at 3 AM wore ship stood to the Eastward so ends these 24 hours laying two under Close reaped maintopsail

Remarks On board Saturday the 17
Commences with heavy gale from the SE laying two under Close Reaped maintopsail at 4 PM set the fore topsail latter part quite moderate the sea running high could not make sail

Sunday Jan the 18
Commences with fresh breeze from the SE at 4 PM made sail and bent the main sail Middle part moderate at 7 AM made all sail so ends these 24 hours with fine weather at 12 PM tacked ship stood to the Southward

Monday Jan the 19
Commences with pleasant gales and fine weather at 4 PM tacked ship and stood to the NE at 11 AM made the Europa Rocks Bearing East Dist 5 leagues the wind NE at 12 AM tacked ship stood to the Southward and Eastward
