Tuesday Jan the 20

Commences with fine breeze from the NE at 4 PM we hoist the main yard aback under the Island of Bapa des Indes sent the larboard boat on shoar at sunset she returned with a large turtle at daylight killed the turtle and give all hands a fresh mess course NE by N the island being 4 Dist 6 leagues

Wednesday Jan the 21

Commences with strong breeze from the ENE middle part moderate at 3 AM tacked ship stood to the Southward and Eastward at 6 AM tacked ship stood to the NE latter part squalls of rain with little wind

Thursday Jan the 22

Commences with light wind and pleasant weather middle part calm with heavy sea from the NE so ends these 24 hours with the watch employed in various jobs and a light air from the ENE

Friday Jan the 23

Commences with a calm wind pleasant weather middle part light air from the SE latter part calm and very hot with the watch employed in various jobs

Saturday Jan the 24

Commences with light air from the West steering ENE with the watch employed in various jobs at 4 PM unbent the fore top sail and bent another latter part light wind and pleasant course NE so ends these 24 hours with fine weather

Sunday Jan the 25

Commences with light wind from the NW with pleasant weather the watch employed in various jobs middle part calm at 10 AM light breeze from the NE

Monday Jan the 26

Commences with light wind and pleasant weather at 7 PM tacked ship steered N by N at 2 AM tacked steered NE with light wind latter part squally with light rain so ends these 24 hours with cloudy weather at 12 AM sounded got bottom in 25 fathoms off Madagascar

Tuesday Jan the 27

Commences with light breeze and pleasant weather at 2 AM tacked ship stood to the Eastward latter part rainy so ends these 24 hours with all hands catching shirks at 12 AM sounded got bottom in 45 fathoms

Wednesday Jan the 28

Commences with light wind and cloudy at 7 PM made the island of Juan d'Novia bearing N N W dist 5 leagues at 2 AM tacked ship stood to the Eastward at daylight saw the land bearing E by S dist 5 leagues at 12 AM hauled aback under the lee of the Island

Thursday Jan the 29

Commences with pleasant weather at 1 PM sent the waist boat on shoar to remain all night to turn turtle at 3 PM the larboard boat went on shoar and caught two with a lance

Friday Jan the 30

Commences with pleasant weather at 4 PM the waist boat came on board with turtle 2 Hawks bill made sail stood from the island with a light breeze from the NE
