Tuesday March the 10 1835
Commences with light wind and pleasant weather at sunset took in sail at daylight made all sail with a light breeze from the NNE at 11 Am. lowered three boats for black fish the waist boat struck and took him along side and cut him in and so ends these 24 hours with a light breeze

Wednesday March the 11
Commences with light breeze and pleasant weather at 8 Am saw the Island of Plate at 9 Am came to an anchor off the west side in 8 fathoms water went on shore and got pumpkins and papa Apples at 12 returned

Thursday March the 12
at 2 PM went on shore for wood and fruit at 5 PM returned with a load of wood and a number of pigeons at 9 Am sent a boat for wood and commenced painting latter part heavy rains so ends these 24 hours

Friday March the 13
Commences with a boats crew on shore for wood at sunset sent a crew on shore for turtle at daylight returned with one latter part Employed in painting ship and getting wood so ends these 24 hours

Saturday March the 14
Commences with painting ship with fine weather at 3 PM went on shore for sand latter part heavy shower of rain so ends these 24 hours with cloudy weather

Sunday March the 15
Commences with fine weather at 2 PM sent a boat on shore for Apples latter part sent a boat on shore for Apples so ends these 24 hours

Monday March the 16 1835
Commences with light wind and squally at 8 Am hove up our anchor and stood out the harbour of Plate so ends these 24 hours steering south

Tuesday March the 17
Commences with light wind and pleasant weather with the watch Employed in pounding the nut from the barboard Chain Middle part heavy squall of rain latter part killed two goats at 11 Am saw the Island of Coiva bearing SE Dist 6 leagues
