Commences with pleasant weather
at 4 PM finished boiling latter part pleasant
painted the starboard boat

Monday June the 8
Commences with pleasant weather at
5 PM spoke the "Herald of Dorchester" Capt
Lincoln with 450 at daylight broke out
and stood down so ends these 24 hours
with fresh gales

Tuesday June the 9
Commences with strong breeze and
rugged with all hands employed in
steering down at 6 finished latter part
washed ship

Wednesday June the 10
Commences with the 9 watch employed
on bending the fore and main topsails
and bending others latter part on
bent the foresail to repair

Thursday June the 11
Commences with fresh gales at 9 Am
spoke the Atlantic Warren Mason Mast
and the "Herald Dorchester" Lincoln Mast
and gamed with the two ships

Friday June the 12
Commences with pleasant weather
at daylight on bent the mainsail
at 9 Am saw a school of whale toward
in company with the Atlantic
did not get fast
