in heaving in the junk at sunset
began to boil at 8 AM bailed the case
which bailed 12 barrels so ends these 24 hours

Commences with pleasant weather
with all hands Employed in boiling
latter part strong breeze and pleasant

Wednesday June the 24
Commences with fresh winds and
pleasant with all hands Employed in
boiling at 9 PM finished at daylight
began to rain at 12 A cleared off

Thursday June the 25
Commences with fresh winds and
squally middle part moderate
at daylight broke out the fore peak
and stowed down

Friday June the 26
Commences with all hands Employed
in stowing down at sunset stowed
down 100 barrels at daylight commenced
again at 12 AM finished stowed down
in all 146 so ends these 24 hours
