

On Board Ship Henry Knudland November 18th 1858
Thursday

First of this day, light southerly winds and fine weather all sail set steering N. Middle part the same latter part wind light from the Eastered weather clear steering the same Employed stowing off the Blubber room and getting out small stores carpenter at work building a seat across the stern

Friday 19th

First of this day, light Easterly winds and clear weather all sail set steering N. Middle part the same latter part wind strong from N.E. to N.E. at 11 A.M. took in the topgallant sails. Employed painting the Lockers across the stern setting up rig in and various other work so ends the 2^d Day under jurg masts

Long 42. 58 W

Saturday 20th

First of this day, strong N.E. and N.W. wind steering by the wind heading N. and N.W. at 1 P.M. set the maintopgallant sail. Middle part wind increasing & B.M. hauled the topgallant sail. Latter part wind and weather the same at 2 A.M. tacked to the Eastered Employed setting up the jib quilts and back ropes painting the stern lockers and the Water Butts so ends this day of the work

On Board the ship Henry Knudland November 21st 1858

Sunday

First of this day, fresh breeze from N by E. and fine clear weather at 2 P.M. to the N.W. and made all sail the wind moderating Middle part light air and Calms latter part light breeze from the E.S.E. heading N.W. and N.W. saw several humpback whales

Monday 22nd

First of this day, light E.S.E. breeze and clear weather all sail set heading N.W. and N.W. at 6 P.M. tacked to the S.E. Middle part wind and weather the same at 2 A.M. tacked to the N.W. at 4 the wind came out N.W. in a squall tacked to the N.E. at 7 it fell calm with a heavy N.E. swell latter part the same two sail in sight waiting for a breeze to go in the Land in sight 35 Miles off and to the West of the

Lat 24. 40 S
Long 43. 40 W

Tuesday 23rd

First of this day, light air and calms at 2 P.M. a light breeze sprang from the S.E. steered N.E. at 3 P.M. the port of Rio Bare N.E. by N. 60 Miles off one sail in sight bound in at 4 got up the the Topmast & topgallant masts studding sails Employed getting out water and meat
