

On Board Ship Henry Kneland Feb 12th 1859

Saturday

First of this day, light airs from the NNE and hazy weather all sail set steering S.W. by W. saw some kelp and several finback whales. Middle part wind fresh inclining to the west at 11 P.M. hauled the top gallant sails & fligibb wind W. Latter part blowing & fresh gale from the S.W. at 4 A.M. Double reefed the topsails and at 8 hauled the jib & spanker at hauled the four & mizen topsails at 8 hauled the four sail blowing & strong gale from S.W.

Sunday 13th

First of this day strong gale from the S.W. & laying to under. Double reefed main topsail and mizen spencer at 4 P.M. Wore ship to the N.W. weather clear and moderating fast at 2 set the four sail at 4 set the four & mizen topsails at 7 P.M. Wore ship to the south and made all sail wind light. Middle part the same Latter part wind light from the north at 6 set lower top mast & top gallant studding sails steering S.W. by W. at 11 A.M. came in foggy saw some finback whales and some kelp so ends

Monday 14th

First of this day, fresh breeze from the NNE and thick fog steering S.W. by W. at 4 P.M. Wind hauled to the N.W. and freshened took in the studding sails and braced up the yards. Middle part wind S.W. and thick fog. Latter part light airs and calms from all points of the compass

On Board Ship Henry Kneland Feb 15th 1859

Tuesday

First of this day, light breeze from S.W. and S.S.W. with thick fog all sail set on the starboard tack heading from W to W.N.W. at 10 tacked to the S.S.W. Middle part wind & weather very changeable Latter part wind from the S.W. and clear weather at 10 A.M. blew a fresh gale. Double reefed the topsails & fished the jib & main sail heading S.E. and S.

Wednesday 16th

First of this day, fresh gale from the S.W. and clear weather ship by the wind under. Double reefed topsails jib & main sail fished head S.E. and S. at 4 P.M. moderated sap the jib & main sail wind inclining to the W.N.W. Middle part strong breeze from the N.W. steering S.W. by W. Latter part wind light and baffled from N.W. to S.W. weather hazy and long swell from the south. Employed oiling the lower masts putting keelson the waist and starboard Boats making pennant and various other work

Thursday 17th

First of this day, light airs from the N. and N.N.W. all sail set heading S.E.W. and S.W. Middle part calm. Latter part light breeze from the S.E. steared S.W. by S. weather hazy. Employed scraping the Deck and various other small work
