

On Board Ship H. Knelland June 11th 1879

Saturday

First of this day, fresh whole sail breeze from the S.S.W. and good weather steering N.W. by N. At 2 P.M. wind freshened handed topgallant sails fligible & topgallant staysail at 4 more moderate set topgallant sails fligible & topgallant staysail wither cloudy but no fog saw some finback whales and some Ducks and this evening there is some land birds on board probably stay the night with us. Middle and latter part wind more moderate and wither broken ship by the wind heading N. many birds in sight of different kinds also saw some kelp.

Sunday 12th

First of this day, fresh whole sail breeze W.N.W. and wither broken ship by the wind heading N. and N by E. saw some finback whales and many birds. Middle part wind and wither the same.

Monday 13th

First of this day, strong W.N.W. wind and cloudy, wither and light fog squalls ship by the wind at 2 P.M. tacked to the West wind inclining to the N.W. and freshened handed the topgallant sails & fligible at 3 P.M. Double reefed the topsails and handed the main course pentz of finback whales in sight some bunches of kelp and very many of birds of various kinds. Middle part wind light and rainy wither latter part wind strong from the N.W. and lower, wither under double reefed topsails at 9 A.M. spoke the Bk. Harmony Capt. Lester from

On Board ship H. Knelland June 14th 1879

Tuesday

First of this day, strong breeze from N.W. ship by the wind heading N.E. and N.E. under double reefed topsails and courses wither changeable in company with Bk. Harmony Capt. Lester at 2 P.M. saw the Island of Amoukhtas at 8 P.M. at Bare N.W. 20 miles off. Wind strong, and thick round the horizon. Beating through Amoukhtas Pass. Mid part strong gale laying to under close reefed main topsail & storm sail. Latter part strong wind and clear wither.

Wednesday 15th

First of this day, strong wind from W.N.W. and clear wither at 1 P.M. wore ship to the North set jib & courses and double reefed topsails at 3 P.M. saw the Island of Segouam Baring N.W. and the Island of Amoukhtas Baring N.E. By cupress Middle part fresh gale and thick wither at 10 P.M. wore ship to the West and hove to under close reefed main topsail and storm sails at 2 A.M. wore to the N.E. Latter part quite clear land in sight Baring N.

Thursday 16th

First of the day fresh N.W. wind and laying to at 2 P.M. wore to West and set fore & main on topsail close reefed at 3 set jib & main sail. Both the islands in sight Middle and latter part good wither wind light Beating through Amoukhtas Pass.
