This day comes in with fine weather
and light ENE wind all sail set
heading to the SSE at 6 PM tack
ed. to the North again with the main
middle and latter part wind and weather
the same ship head to the North & N.W.
saw some killers & a few seal the Bk.
Paulina in sight when it lights a little
No Observations this day so Ends

Saturday 8th

This day comes in with light N.E.
Wind with cloudy weather and passing fogs
squalls. all sail set on the ship heading
N.W.W. at 6 PM. wind freshened hauled
the main royal main top gallant sail & main
top gallant stasail. Middle part wind
fresh from N.W. and no fog but thick cloudy
& smoky weather hauled main top gallant sail
and fly jib. Latter part fresh gale at 4 PM
hauled up the courses at 8 Double reefed
topsails at 7 hauled the jib at close
Reefed the topsails furl'd the courses &
Wore ship to the N.W. one sail in sight

Sunday 9th

This day comes in with fresh gales from
N.W. ship heading N.W. under close reefed
topsails & top mast stasails at 1 PM.
Wore ship to the E.N.E. at 8 PM wore to the
N.W. Middle part wind and weather the same
Latter part wind more moderate at 6 AM
Wore to the E. again further quite clear
one sail in sight heading to the East

On Board ship Henry Kneland August 8th 159
Monday

This day comes in with fresh N.W. wind
Ship under close reefed topsails heading to
the E. at 1 PM. wore to the N.W. at 4 PM
Exchanged Longitudes with Bk. Paulina
and wore to the E. and made Double reef
topsails & courses & jib. Steered E by S.
Middle part wind light and weather hazy. Made
all sail Latter part wind fresh weather cloudy
With passing fog squalls & sail in sight

Tuesday 10th

This day comes in with fresh North wind and
thick cloudy & hazy weather all sail set by the wind
heading E.N.E. at 1 PM. Saw Cape Lishurn and
stood close in shore 10 sail in sight 3 at
Anchor at 4 PM spoke ship Hibernia 2^d &
Ship Magnolia at 4 PM Steered S.S.W. at
5 Steered E. at 6 Came by the wind heading
N.W.W. and hauled light sails Double reefed
first main sail & main course saw a
Whale spout twice did ascertain what kind
he was at 10 PM wore to the E. and at 3 AM
Wore to N.W. at 5 AM steared off S.E. along
shore at 8 passed Point Hope steering
S.W. at 9 spoke the ship Saratoga Capt
Stecum came on board for his papers stayed
half an hour at 10 the Europa of Edgarton
Spoke us Capt. Munter came on board
and we steered W.S.W. wind North and
Weather good saw two whale spouts
But did not stop to see what they
were so Ends the 10 of August
