



On Board Ship H. Knudland Sept 30th 159
Friday

first of this day light N.W. wind and heavy
 weather all sail set steering S.E. at 2 P.M. saw
 two white whales at 3 lowered for them and
 chased until dark all success hoisted up
 the boats and kept off our course again and
 hauled up the courses one sail in sight bound
 to the S.E. Middle part fresh gale from the N.W.
 at 10 P.M. Double reefed the topsails and filed the
 gill and courses at 11 P.M. hauled the four and
 Mizzen topsails maintopmast staysail close
 reefed the main topsail and came by the wind
 heading W. latter part more moderate at 11 P.M.
 set Double reefed topsails gill & main topmast
 staysail by the wind eight sail in sight no
 whales but plenty of fish seal so ends this
 month

Saturday October 1st 159

first of this day fresh N.W. wind and thick cloudy
 weather ship under Double reefed topsails gill & main
 topmast staysail heading W. by the wind at 1 P.M.
 cleared S.E. by S. and set the four sail at 5 P.M.
 saw one white whale could not get to him
 before dark at 6 P.M. came by the wind head to
 N.E. and hauled up the four sail & sail in sight
 Middle part light bafflin airs and calms laying
 with head yards aback at 6 P.M. sprang up a fresh
 breeze from the S. N.E. Double reefed the topsails and
 filed gill and four sail heading to the S.S.E. at 8 P.M.
 wore ship to the N.N.E. with thick snow and
 heavy weather at 11 A.M. saw three whales did lower
 for them at 11 A.M. spoke the ship julian and
 the captain came on board so ends this
 day two more ships in sight

On Board Ship Henry Knudland October 2nd 159
Sunday

first of this day fresh E. wind and
 thick rainy weather ship under Double reefed topsails
 four maintopmast & Mizzen staysails heading
 N.N.E. with the main yard aback gamsing with
 the ship julian at 1 P.M. the ship Rebecca
 Sims and Bk. Archetes spoke us the captain
 came on board at 2 1/2 P.M. the captain went on
 board their ships. Bound to the Islands at 3
 We steered S by E. and bound all for the Islands
 Middle part wind more moderate at 9 P.M. wore to the
 N.E. at 6 A.M. wore to the South and made all sail
 latter part light airs and thick rainy weather three
 sail in sight steering to the South saw nothing
 but seal Latitude by Dead reckoning 57.46.00

Monday 3rd

first of this day light bafflin airs from
 E.S.E. to E. ship by the wind heading S by W
 to S.S.E. with all sail set three sail in sight
 bound to the south Middle part moderate wind
 from the North steered S.S.E. latter part wind
 strong from N.W. steering the same at 9 A.M.
 filed the gill staysails main sail & crockie sails
 ship under whole topsails four sail main & mizzen
 topgallant sails & main royal Lat 56.22 N
 Long 110.35 W

Tuesday 4th

first of this day fresh N.W. wind and
 cloudy weather steering S by E 1/2 E. under whole topsails
 four sail topgallant sails & main royal three sail
 in sight steering south Middle part wind strong
 with frequent snow squalls latter part the same
 at 8 A.M. set the fore topmast & lower studding sails
 and steered S.S.E. employed getting out water
 Lat 53.07 N
 Long 111.01 W
