Middle and latter part fine wether and light N.W. wind all sail set steering S.E. and S.E. by E. watch employed repairing in 3 mizen topsail we have been repairing also repairing and coiling the lines securing up and setting up the bobstay taking off and putting on the bands round the mizen mast securing on ratlines and various other small work

first of this day fine wether and light N.W. wind all sail set steering S.E. by E. one sail in sight steering the same as we are Middle and Latter part wind and wether the same Employed repairing 6 four and mizen topsail making them larger so ends another day two sail in sight bound to the south

first of this day fine wether and light wind from the N.W. to S.W. all sail set steering S. by E. at 4 P.M. bent the mizen topsail that we have been repairing two sail in sight Bound to the south Middle and latter moderate breeze fresh variable from N.W. to W.S.W. and fine wether Employed repairing an old four topsail. Carpenter employed making camp stools

first of this day fine wether and moderate variable winds from N.W. to W.S.W. all sail set steering S. by E. Middle part wind and wether the same Latter part fresh North wind and hower, Wether all sail set hat will draw steering S. by E. Employed making over an old four topsail carpenter Employed bottoming camp chairs and taking the Seal in out of an old Boat to paint her inside so ends another day

Saturday 22nd

first of this day fresh North wind and showery wether all sail set that will draw steering S. by E. two sail in sight steering to the south Middle and Latter part fresh N.E. trades and good wether at 2 P.M. hauled in the lower studding sail out at 1 P.M. the top mast studding sail one sail in sight steering S.W. Watch employed washing ship inside and scraping & slushing top mast & top gallant masts. Carpenter painting the inside of an old Boat and putting in the sealings so ends

Sunday 23rd

Long 154.36 W.

first of this day fresh N.E. trade winds and good wether all sail set but top mast lower studding sail steering S. Middle part wind and wether the same at 8 A.M. saw the Island of Oahu the port of Hilo 25 miles off Latter part light & hazy air and calms and thick rimey weather got up the chains and bent them and secured benches off the Bow right in studding sails and stowed away the studding sails & gear but there is no chance of getting in this day so ends the 18th day. Then we come through the N. Passage of the Fox Islands. saw one fin back whale and one albatross on the Passage good luck
