from the Eastward and pleasant weather
latter part the same at 2 a.m. spoke the
big Thomas Winslow of Westport Capt
Kaseb So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday these 24 hours commences with light
June 29 winds from the Eastward and pleasant
1841 weather at 4 a.m. spoke large Cornelia
of New Bedford Capt. [unclear] middle
part light winds from the South
and pleasant weather latter part the same
four sails in sight at 10 a.m.
So ends these 24 hours

Wednesday these 24 hours commences with light
June 30 winds from the Eastward and pleasant
1841 middle part light winds from the South
latter part light winds and pleasant
at 6 a.m. saw sperm whale heard
H 32. 22 the boat and got lost and parted
by 68. 20 So ends these 24 hours

Thursday these 24 hours commences with light winds
July 1 from the South two sails in sight at 5 p.m.
1841 spoke the bark Cornelia of New Bedford by going
middle part fine weather latter part the
H 32. 20 same pleasant weather
by 68. 13 So ends these 24 hours

Friday these 24 hours commences with gentle breezes
July 2 from the South two sails in sight at 11
1841 middle part gentle breezes from the South
and pleasant weather latter part the same
H 31. 51 saw a number of sails to the South
by 67. 54 So ends these 24 hours

Saturday these 24 hours commences with gentle
July 3 breezes from the South and Westward
1841 and pleasant weather saw a number of sails
middle part strong winds from the
South and Eastward and rainy weather
H 31. 54 latter part the same two sails in sight
by 67. 05 So ends these 24 hours

Sunday these 24 hours commences with strong
July 4 winds from the South and rainy
1841 the bark Cornelia in sight at 11
middle part strong winds from the South
latter part strong winds from the South
and rainy weather and very thick
by 67. 01 So ends these 24 hours

Monday these 24 hours commences with light winds
July 5 and a heavy dew on shore sails in
1841 sight middle part good weather and a
heavy swell in latter part strong winds
from the North and Eastward at 11 a.m.
H 32. 22 spoke the ship [unclear] of Fairhaven
by 67. 19 So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday these 24 hours commences with strong winds
July 6 from the North and Eastward and rainy
1841 middle part strong winds from the
North and Eastward and squally weather
latter part the same saw two
H 32. 15 seamen and one ship
by 66. 37 So ends these 24 hours
