

Wednesday these 24 hours commences with strong
July the 9 winds from the south and westward
1841 and squally with one squall in site
middle part strong winds from the
south and westward latter part the same
at 12 O'clock saw a sperm whale
and carry up a heavy squall of rain
Lat 32.10 and long 65.10
So ends these 24 hours

Thursday these 24 hours commences with strong
July the 10 winds from the south and westward
1841 and squally and going a thick
at 6 o'clock saw the land the
Isle of Bermuda bearing East Dist 2
middle part some squally of rain latter
part the same at 12 O'clock off to the south
by 64.35 of George town Bermuda 5 m Dist

Friday these 24 hours commences with gentle breeze
July 9 from the south and westward the land in site
1841 middle part gentle breeze from the south
and westward and thick smoky weather
latter part the same nothing in site
Lat 34.15 and long 62.20
So ends these 24 hours

Saturday these 24 hours commences with gentle
July the 10 breeze from the south and westward and
1841 thick heavy weather nothing in site to day
middle part thick raining weather latter
part the same nothing in site of us
Lat 35.30 and long 60.30
So ends these 24 hours

Sunday these 24 hours commences with light winds from
July the 11 westward and thick weather nothing in site
1841 middle part strong winds from the south
and squally weather latter part the
same nothing in site of us
Lat 36.25 and long 58.15
So ends these 24 hours

Monday these 24 hours commences with strong winds
July the 12 from the south and squally weather and
1841 heavy weather middle part strong winds from
the south and squally weather latter part the
same two sails in site of us and a big
Lat 36.21 and long 53.10
So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday these 24 hours commences with strong winds
July the 13 from the south and heavy weather at 4 m
1841 spoke the brig Argate of New Bedford Capt Comell
middle part strong winds and heavy weather
latter part the same and very squally with
Lat 38.11 and long 52.10
So ends these 24 hours

Wednesday these 24 hours commences with strong winds
July the 14 from the south and heavy sea on and
1841 very squally weather middle part a strong
gale from the south latter part strong winds
two sails in site of us to day
Lat 41.30 and long 51.30
So ends these 24 hours

Thursday these 24 hours commences with strong
July the 15 winds from the south and eastward
1841 and heavy weather and squally hinder
with rain middle part strong winds and rain
latter part gentle breeze from the south and
Lat 36.54 and long 51.29
So ends these 24 hours

Friday these 24 hours commences with light winds
July the 16 from the south and eastward and light
1841 weather nothing in site of us middle part calm
latter part strong winds from the south and
eastward and squally weather saw bits
of Spain
Lat 36.45 and long 51.13
So ends these 24 hours
