July 10 winds and squally some rain two sails
1842 in site of us to day middle part tide winds
from the Eastward and pleasant weather at 4 P.M.

Southward at 6 P.M. spoke the bark John
of Edgartown Dept Mass latter part
At 35.24 fine weather and calm
by 47.10 So ends the 24 hours

Monday the 24 hours commences with tide winds
July 11 from the Eastward and pleasant weather

the winds from the South at 4 P.M. some
a bark from the brig Gemini Dept Albany
At 35.40 bound to London let them have some hay and
by 47.25 bread So ends the 24 hours

At 6 A.M. saw black fly boat
At 35.43 the boat and got one
by 46.49 So ends the 24 hours

Wednesday the 24 hours commences with tide winds
July 13 from the South and pleasant weather four sails
1842 in site middle part gentle breeze from the
boat and Westward and pleasant at 3 A.M.
spoke the bark Oregon of New Bedford
Dept Clarke latter part squally weather and
At 36.15 sailing two sails in site of us
by 43.24 So ends the 24 hours
