 1843 Boomer standing to the South East
 middle part Strong winds from the
 South and Eastward and thick weather
 Lt 30-20 better part the same nothing in it
 by 74.00 So ends the 26th hr

Monday the 26th hours Commences with the wind
 Jan 9 from the South and Eastward at 2
 1843 P.M. saw a bark standing to the South
 at 5 P.M. sounded got below
 20 fathoms grey sand and shells
 middle part strong winds from the South
 and thick and rainy better part the wind
 Lt 40-40 from the South and thick fog. 40 fathoms
 by 75.00 So ends the 27th hr

Tuesday the 26th hours Commences with the wind
 Jan 10 from the South and thick fog
 1843 at 4 P.M. 40 fathoms of water
 middle part the wind from the South
 Lt 40-10 in clouds and thick fog better part
 by 70-00 the same So ends the 28th hr

Wednesday the 26th hours Commences with the
 Jan 11 winds from the South and thick fog
 1843 at 5 P.M. hiked up and saw land
 at 8 A.M. saw mountains
 it as a clear sea blue to the
 bargains. at 8 A.M. left the wind
 at 10 boat came off thick fog.

Thursday the 26th hours Commences with the wind
 Jan 12 to the East thick fog wind from the
 1843, large waves sounding from 20 to 15
 fathoms better part the same
 thick fog and rainy saw nothing
 So ends the 29th hr

Friday the 26th hours Commences with the wind from
 Jan 13 the South and foggy and rainy see nothing
 1843 middle part the wind all over the Company and
 thick fog at 4 A.M. saw a bark to the
 bearing of the boat at 4 A.M. saw the
 land at 8 A.M. set all in thick fog again
 and continued to do ends the 30th hr

Saturday the 26th hours Commences with the wind all
 Jan 14 from the Company saw a bark standing to the
 1843 South thick fog.

 Dec 19 from the North and Westward middle part
 1843 the same better part squally and rainy
 Lt 40-30 So ends the 32nd hr
 by 70-25

Wednesday the 26th hours Commences with strong
 Dec 20 wind from the South and Westward
 middle part squally with
 Lt 39-29 better part the same
 by 69.00
