

Saturday May 23 these 24 hours commenced with the winds from the South and Eastward and light with middle part strong winds from the ESE and squally with latter part the same saw a number of ships to the windward
at 24. 12 by 22. 20

Sunday May 30 these 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the same Eastward and squally with middle part strong winds from the ESE and squally with latter part the same saw a number of sails all about
at 24. 38 by 24. 19

Monday May 31 these 24 hours commenced with the strong winds from the ESE and squally with middle part strong winds from the ESE and squally with latter part the same three sails in sight saw a steamer bound the South
at 25. 15 by 20. 01

Tuesday June 1 these 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the South and Eastward and pleasant middle part strong winds from the South and latter part from the North West and thick weather saw two sails to the North and West
at 27. 40 by 27. 00

Wednesday June 2 these 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the South West and thick cloudy weather one sail in sight middle part the winds from the East latter part strong winds from the North and a heavy swell one saw three sails
at 28. 27 by 28. 20

Thursday June 3 these 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the North and Eastward at 2. PM saw several whales going to the windward ice and heard the boats but did not get past middle part with winds from the North and Eastward and pleasant weather latter part the same so a whaling bark to the South
at 28. 35 by 27. 57

Friday June 4 these 24 hours commenced with the winds from the North and Eastward and pleasant with middle part the winds from the Westward and pleasant weather latter part the same with in sight to day
at 28. 22 by 27. 38

Saturday June 5 these 24 hours commenced with the winds from the South and Eastward and pleasant with middle part strong winds from the South and Eastward and squally thunder and lightning latter part squally and squally
at 28. 58 by 26. 50

Sunday June 6 these 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the North and squally at 2 PM spoke the bark ship of whaling bark Capt Baker middle part strong winds from the Eastward and squally weather latter part the same with in sight
at 29. 21 by 27. 09

Monday June 7 these 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the Eastward and squally with in sight the middle part strong winds from the ESE and some squally latter part the same saw a number of sails
at 30. 40 by 27. 18

Tuesday June 8 these 24 hours commenced with strong winds from the ESE and squally with middle part strong winds and squally thunder and lightning and rain latter part squally and squally
at 31. 12 by 27. 30

Wednesday June 9 these 24 hours commenced with strong winds and squally with in sight saw the bark ship of whaling bark latter part strong winds from the South and squally and squally with saw one ship to the North
at 31. 35 by 27. 30
