the 8
1838

This 24 hours Commences with strong
winds from the south and squally weather
off to the south of Lhasa middle part
strong winds from the south and
ragged weather latter part strong
winds and rainy weather saw the
Barge to pinklin: & upon
off to the south of Lhasa
So ends these 24 hours

Thursday
October
the 4
1838

This 24 hours Commences with
strong winds from the south and
rainy weather and ragged squally
middle part strong winds from the
south at 4 am the winds shifted
to the S.W. and blew very
strong and very ragged and thick
So ends these 24 hours

Friday
October
the 5
1838

This 24 hours Commences with strong
winds from the S.W. and large
and thick and rainy weather
middle part strong winds from the south
latter part strong winds from the south
at 8 hours we went on shore
to angva and bent potatoes and
onions and potatoes in Company
with the Ship. Triton of warship and
Capt. Parker so ends
