November
the 12
1838

these 24 hours Commences with Lite winds from
from the Southwest at 4 pm part latest to the
big grey Gardner of Philadelphia steering South
middle part Lite winds and some heavy rain
latter part fine weather at 12 o'clock spoke
the Ship genl Smith of Baltimore Capt
Lemon so ends the 24 hours
Lat ab 4. 26 S Long by Chronometer 22. 17 W

Tuesday
November
the 13
1838

these 24 hours Commences with Lite winds from
South and Eastward three sails in site of us
middle part Lite winds from the South
and some squally latter part strong winds
from the S E and squally and raged three
sails in site so ends the 24 hours
Lat ab 3. 05 S Long 23. 30 W

Wednesday
November
the 14
1838

these 24 hours Commences with strong winds
from the S E and raged one sail in site
middle part strong winds from the South and some
squally latter part the same one sail in site
so ends the 24 hours
Lat ab 1. 39 S Long by Chronometer 24. 12 W

Thursday
November
the 15
1838

these 24 hours Commences with strong winds
from the S E and some squally weather one
sail in site middle part strong winds from the
South latter part Lite winds from the S E
at 11 am heard after blackfish got on
took him along side and took him in
so ends the 24 hours
Lat ab 0. 26 S Long by Chronometer 24. 57 W
