Tuesday
November
the 27
1838
these 24 hours commences with light
winds from the North and Eastward at
4 P.M. saw a schooner to the South of us
middle part strong breezes from the N.E.
latter part the same nothing in site
So ends these 24 hours
Lat 35. 16 N Long 35. 48 W

Wednesday
November
the 28
1838
these 24 hours commences with strong
breezes from the North and Eastward
at 6 P.M. spoke the barque President of
westport Capt. Hicks mid part strong
winds latter part the same rough weather
So ends these 24 hours
Lat 36. 16 N Long 36. 11 W

Thursday
November
the 29
1838
these 24 hours commences with strong winds
from the North and Eastward at 4 P.M. spoke
the brig Crofted of warrens Capt. Luce
middle part strong winds from the North
latter part the same. Saw two brigs stand
ing to the Eastward so ends these 24 hours
Lat 36. 20 N Long 36. 20 W

Friday
November
the 30
1838
these 24 hours commences with strong
winds from the North and Eastward and
rough weather middle part strong winds
from the N.E. at 2 P.M. a brig
past us bound to the westward latter
part more moderate one sail in site
So ends these 24 hours
Lat 36. 17 N Long 36. 13 W
