these 24 hours Commences with strong
winds from the Eastward at 4 p.m. saw
a barque to the Eastward of us
middle part gentle breezes from the Eastward
latter part the same two sails in sight
So ends the 24 hours
Lat obs 17° 01' S Long in 36° 45' W

Saturday
December
the 22
1838

these 24 hours Commences with gentle breezes
from the north and Eastward two sails in
sight middle part gentle breezes from the
Eastward latter part the same saw a
number of sails a boat as
So ends the 24 hours
Lat obs 17° 04' S Long in 36° 18' W

Sunday
December
the 23
1838

these 24 hours Commences with gentle
breezes from the north and Eastward and
pleasant weather two sails in sight of us
middle part light winds from the Eastward
latter part the same four sails in sight
at 12 o'clock spoke the mainmast of a vessel
So ends the 24 hours
Lat obs 17° 12' S Long in 36° 05' W

Monday
December
the 24
1838

these 24 hours Commences with light winds
from the Eastward four sails in sight
middle part light winds from the
North and Eastward latter part the same
some squally rain spoke the brig Charles
of west, out Capt. Jacob So ends the 24 hours
Lat obs 16° 50' S Long in 35° 48' W
