from all round the Camp all a number of sails
in site middle part Lite winds from the ship
and Eastward latter part the same spoke the
Ship goes looking at Bristol Bay Simmons
So ends these 24 hours
Lat at 16. 57. 1 Long 136. 50. 2

Friday
January
the 25
1839

these 24 hours Commences with Lite winds from
the north and Eastward at 4 pm spoke the
back Bennett of Falmouth Capt Jacob
middle part Lite winds from the north and East
latter part strong winds and thick cloudy weather
So ends these 24 hours
Lat at 16. 57. 1 Long 136. 30

Saturday
January
the 26
1839

these 24 hours Commences with strong winds
from the E N E and thick cloudy weather
middle part strong winds and squally weather
latter part the same three sails in
site So ends these 24 hours
Lat at 16. 57. 1 Long 136. 50

Sunday
January
the 27
1839

these 24 hours Commences with strong
winds from the E E and squally weather
three sails in site middle part strong
winds from North East latter part the same
and rain weather nothing in site of us
So ends these 24 hours
Lat at 16. 57. 1 Long 136. 50

Monday
January
the 28
1839

these 24 hours Commences with strong winds
from the North East and rainy weather and
rough middle part strong winds from the
North and Eastward latter part the same
at 6 am spoke the ship Almirante
of Edgartown Capt Flanders
So ends these 24 hours
Lat at 17. 57. 1 Long 136. 51. 00
