1839 these 24 hours Commences with gentle breezes
from the Eastward blowing off to the south
of the Island of Portoreco or Dead Chest middle
part like winds from the Eastward and pleasant
weather latter part the same off to the south
of Portoreco so Ends these 24 hours

Monday
march
the 25
1839 these 24 hours Commences with like winds from the
south and Eastward and pleasant weather middle part
like winds and pleasant weather latter part the
same off to the south of the Dead Chest Portoreco
so Ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
march
the 26
1839 these 24 hours Commences with like winds from the
Eastward at 1 P.m the boat went on leave to the Dead
Chest at 5 P.m came on board with a load of wood
middle part like winds from the Eastward latter part
the same at 12 O'clock came to anchor the west side
of the Dead Chest so Ends the 24 hours

Wednesday
march
the 27
1839 these 24 hours Commences with like winds from the
Eastward on stave getting wind middle part like winds
and pleasant latter part strong winds from the
Eastward imployed in getting wood so Ends

Thursday
march
the 28
1839 these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from
the Eastward on stave working middle part strong
winds from the Eastward at 7 a.m we got up the
anchor and went to sea saw a ship running
down the land and went in to pour
so Ends the 24 hours

Lat obs 17° 39' long is 86° 30' or 31'
