the 29
1839 these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from
Eastward blowing off to the south of the Dead Chest
middle part strong winds from the Eastward
latter part the same at 12 O'clock saw 4 sperm
whales board the boats and so ends these 24 hours

Saturday
march
the 30
1839 these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from
the Eastward blowing whales at 1 P.m. got 1 and
billed one at 3 a.m. took him along side and went to
bating at 6 a.m. got there middle part pleasant
the watch employed in clearing 2 was the lead
latter part employed in baying the whale
so ends these 24 hours lat ab 17° 42' long by 68° 00' W

Sunday
march
the 31
1839 these 24 hours Commences with light from the west
employed in baying middle part light winds from
all round the compass latter part the same employed
in baying at 12 O'clock got there so ends these 24
lat ab 17° 40' N long by 68° 00' W

Monday
april
the 1
1839 these 24 hours Commences with light winds from the
south and Eastward and some squalls of rain middle
part light from the Eastward latter part the same
employed in stowing down the oil Cape Roxo
bearing N. by W. dist 10 miles so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
april
the 2
1839 these 24 hours Commences with light winds from the
East and pleasant at 2 P.m. saw 4 sperm whales
board the boats and got two of them at 4 took them
along side middle part light wind from the Eastward
latter part the same at 12 O'clock got there
cutting in the whales so ends these 24 hours
off to the south of Cape Roxo portoreo
