

1839 Saturday these 24 hours commences with strong winds from  
the Eastward and thick wetter middle part gentle  
breezes from the Eastward latter part the same at  
5 a m saw a long to the south of us steering S by  
Lat ab 21..00 Long 24..00

1839 Sunday these 24 hours commences with gentle breezes from the  
Eastward and thick cloudy wetter one big in site  
middle part strong winds and some squally at 3 p  
30 m a m saw the Land West as soon as we off shore  
but daylight found it to be Cape Antonio de Cuba

at 10 a m lat of heavy squall from the East at 12 Oct  
Lat 21.50  
the Cape bore East Dist 3 m 10 lns

1839 Monday these 24 hours commences with squally wetter a big  
and squall in site raining with middle part the  
winds from the Eastward and some squally latter  
part good wetter so ends these 24 hours  
Lat ab 23..20 Long 25..20

1839 Tuesday these 24 hours commences with light winds from the  
Eastward middle part the same pleasant wetter  
latter part light winds from the North and East  
and pleasant wetter saw one sail to the  
East so ends these 24 hours  
Lat ab 24..37 Long 26..16
