South East and pleasant weather saw a grampus
middle part gentle breez and pleasant weather at 7.30 am
saw a sperm whale heard the two quarter boats Starboard
boat got fast and killed the whale at 11 am took him a
long side went to work and got up the tacks and
So Ends these 24 hours

Thursday
At 31

these 24 hours Commences with strong winds and raged all
birds employed in bleave out the blubber room for to
take the whale under took to but but some had to quit
blowing very heavy middle part blowing very heavy
and very raged at 3 am fasted the flock rags and
lost the whale at 8 am the wind side same but a heavy
sea running set the fore top sail and fore sail and spencer
So Ends these 24 hours

Friday
At 1
1839
At 32..30
Long 48.00
these 24 hours Commences with strong wind and a heavy sea and
some rain no prospect of seeing my whale again
middle part strong winds from the SLE and raged
and rainy latter part the same at 5 am had a
very heavy squall from the South and Eastward
knocked down and carried away my Starboard boat
Tacks and lost the boat oars and every thing that
belong to her then went to work and took in the
waist boat lashed the Starboard boat up to Tackboard
So Ends these 24 hours
