Monday these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the S.S.W. and squally rough weather some rain middle part strong winds from the westward latter part strong winds from the westward at 12 o'clock part the ship masts of Charleston bound to the N.E. so Ends these 24 hours

Tuesday these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the S.S.W. and some squally of rain employed in drying rigging middle part gentle breezes from the south and westward latter part the same sailing in tide so Ends these 24 hours

Wednesday these 24 hours Commences with gentle breezes from the S.S.W. and pleasant weather employed in fitting the main rigging and boats Davy middle part strong winds from the south west latter part the same so Ends these 24 hours

Thursday these 24 hours Commences with strong breezes from the south and westward employed in securing rigging middle part strong winds from the south and westward latter part strong winds from the south and westward some squalls of rain sailing in tide so Ends these 24 hours
