So ends these 24 hours

Thursday these 24 hours commences with gentle breezes from the
North 30 Eastward and pleasant weather some little squalls of rain
1840 middle part strong winds from the Eastward and pleasant
the 24 latter part gentle breezes from the E S E some little
Log 33.13 squalls of rain So ends these 24 hours

Friday these 24 hours commences with gentle wind from the
North 31 E S E and pleasant weather of us to day at all
1840 middle part gentle winds from the Eastward and
the 28 some thick latter part light winds and some
Log 32.27 squall of rain So ends these 24 hours

Saturday these 24 hours commences with light winds from
the Eastward at 3 PM by shore the brig Anne of
1840 Baltimore Capt Smith middle part light winds from
the South and Eastward latter part calms and raining
Log 32.20 and thick So ends these 24 hours

Sunday these 24 hours commences with calms at 1 AM
Feb the 2 got a breeze from the North and Eastward and wind
1840 middle part light winds from the Eastward and thick
the 22 latter part light winds from all round the compass
Log 30.30 So ends these 24 hours

Monday these 24 hours commences with light winds from the
Feb the 3 Eastward at 8 PM saw black fish board the boat
1840 and got one middle part strong winds from the
the 23 East and thick weather latter part strong winds
Log 31.30 and thick aged weather nothing in sight
no So ends these 24 hours
