

Friday the 28th 1840 these 24 hours commences with gentle breeze from the Eastward and pleasant weather off to the S. W. of St. A Coise middle part strong winds from the Eastward and pleasant weather latter part strong winds and rough weather off to the South of Portorico spoke the bark of New Bedford Capt Davis and the brig of Bristol Capt Lape So ends these 24 hours

Saturday the 29th 1840 these 24 hours commences with strong wind from the Eastward and rough middle part strong winds from the Eastward latter part gentle breeze from the Eastward off to the South of Portorico So ends these 24 hours

Sunday the 30th 1840 these 24 hours commences with light winds from the Eastward at 3 P.M. saw a hump back the brig in the middle part strong winds from the North and thick weather latter part gentle breeze from the Eastward and pleasant weather of the Little hills So ends these 24 hours

Monday the 31st 1840 these 24 hours commences with gentle breeze from the Eastward and pleasant saw some merchantmen bound to the westward middle part strong winds and squally weather latter squally and rainy weather off to the South of the Little Hills porto rico westward So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday the 1st 1840 these 24 hours commences with strong winds and squally weather and raining at 4 P.M. spoke the bark of New Bedford Capt Davis 6 middle part strong winds from the Eastward and thick rainy weather latter part the same at 11 A.M. spoke the barque President of westport Capt Licks So ends these 24 hours
