1840 middle part light winds from the Eastward and
pleasant weather later part fine weather saw many boats
leave the boats but did not get fast so Ends these 24 hours

Wednesday these 24 hours commences with light winds from the Eastward
and pleasant weather saw a bark to the South of us
1840 middle part light winds from the Eastward and pleasant
weather later part the same at 10 a.m. spoke the
barkue barby of westport Capt Macomber
So Ends these 24 hours

Thursday these 24 hours commences with Calms saw a
number of sails off to the South of the little
1840 hills portorico middle part light winds from the North
and pleasant weather later part light winds from
the Eastward and pleasant weather off to the South
of Cape Roxo So Ends these 24 hours

Friday these 24 hours commences with light winds from
the Eastward and pleasant weather saw nothing but
1840 sails no whales middle part strong winds and
rainy weather later part strong winds from
the Eastward and aged so Ends these 24 hours

Saturday these 24 hours commences with strong winds from
the Eastward and aged saw a ship and a brig sailing
1840 to the west middle part light winds from the East
and pleasant weather later part fine weather
saw nothing so Ends these 24 hours
