these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the Eastward and very rough weather off to the South of the Sea Chest Portofeco west in the middle part strong winds from the Eastward and rough weather. Latter part the same off to South of Portofeco so ends these 24 hours

Sunday
the 16
1840

these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the Eastward and rough at 2 P.m. spoke the barque Por Franklin of Newport Capt Francis middle part strong winds from the Eastward and rough weather. Latter part the same saw a number of humpbacks the bark Por Franklin in site so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
the 17
1840

these 24 hours commences with strong winds and squally weather and very rough saw two ships bound to the westward middle part strong winds and rough. Latter part strong winds and very rough weather off to the South of the little hills so ends these 24 hours

Sunday
the 18
1840

these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the Eastward and very rough weather. Saw humpbacks middle part strong winds from the Eastward and very rough weather. Latter part the same off to the South of Portofeco west in site so ends these 24 hours

Sunday
the 19
1840

these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the Eastward and very rough weather. Saw no whaler man to day middle part strong winds from the Eastward. Latter part strong winds and rough weather off to the South of the Sea Chest so ends these 24 hours
