Saturday
Mar the 21
1840

these 24 hours commences with gentle breeze from the Eastward at 4.30 Pm saw a sperm whale at 5.00 boat the boats and did not see him a game middle part gentle breeze and pleasant wether latter part the same at 11 am saw a sperm whale
So ends these 24 hours

Sunday
Mar the 22
1840

these 24 hours commences with strong winds from Eastward and pleasant at 10 am and at 1 Pm got part and killed at 2 Pm took him along side and went to cutting middle part some squally at 6 am went to cutting a game at 12 got the head off so ends these 24 hours

Monday
Mar the 23
1840

these 24 hours commences with strong winds and raged inlayade in cutting at 6 Pm got crews went to work to clear away the bark mid part like winds at 6 am commences boiling latter part boiling the blubber
So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
Mar the 24
1840

these 24 hours commences with gentle winds from the Eastward all hands inlayade in boiling middle part strong winds from the Eastward and raged wether latter part the same all hands inlayade in boiling very raged wether so ends these 24 hours
