

Thursday the 9th 1840 these 24 hours Commence with strong winds from Eastward and pleasant weather at anchor at the Dead Chest fishing rigging middle part strong winds and rough weather later part the same at the Dead Chest So ends these 24 hours

Friday the 10th 1840 these 24 hours Commence with gentle breezes from the Eastward and pleasant weather at the Dead Chest middle part light winds and longer ranging squalls at 9 a.m. got under way later part strong winds and squally So ends these 24 hours

Saturday the 11th 1840 these 24 hours Commence with gentle breezes from the Eastward and pleasant weather at 6 P.M. spoke the bank president of westport Capt. Hicks middle part gentle breeze from the Eastward later part strong winds and rough weather off to the south of Porto Rico So ends these 24 hours

Sunday the 12th 1840 these 24 hours Commence with strong wind from the Eastward and rough weather sails in sight of us all whale men middle part strong winds and squally at 1 a.m. saw black fish boat two boats and got one later part strong winds and squally rough weather saw a number of sails So ends these 24 hours

Monday the 13th 1840 these 24 hours Commence with strong winds and squally rough weather off to the south of Porto Rico middle part strong winds and rough weather later part the same rough and squally So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday the 14th 1840 these 24 hours Commence with strong winds from the Eastward and rough weather two sails in sight middle part strong winds and rough weather and rainy weather later part strong winds and very rough weather and squally So ends these 24 hours
