to the 25
1840 these 24 hours commences with lites winds from
the westward and pleasant weather at 4 pm spoke
the lower looking of boat East Davis fine with
middle part gentle winds from the Eastward and
pleasant weather latter part lites winds and
rainy weather two sails in site off to the south
of the white cliffs so ends these 24 hours

Sunday
to the 26
1840 these 24 hours commences with strong winds from
the south and rainy weather middle part strong
gale from the south and Eastward and very rough
weather in sambar bay latter part gentle however
from the south and Eastward at 8 pm we saw the light
board the boat but did not get past off to the south
of the white cliffs so ends these 24 hours

Monday
to the 27
1840 these 24 hours commences with strong winds from
the south and Eastward and very rough weather
middle part strong gale from the south and very
rough latter part the same to big lower part
in site of us off to the south of red oak
harbor so ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
to the 28
1840 these 24 hours commences with strong winds from
the south and very rough and squally and lites wind
middle part a strong gale from the south
and squally latter part a strong gale from the
south and some heavy squalls from the south
so ends these 24 hours

Wednesday
to the 29
1840 these 24 hours commences with a strong gale from
the south and very rough at 3 pm came to
anchor in botany bay low of Demingo westward
middle part strong winds from the Eastward latter
part the same employed in breaking out the
Drowians so ends these 24 hours
