breezes from the south and eastward and thick
with latter part the same saw a great number
of sails and saw the land to the west of key
west So ends the 24 hours

these 24 hours commences with gentle breezes from
to S 8 E and thick weather at 2 P.m past key
saw left house at dist 8 miles saw key west
and a number of sails middle part strong
winds from the south latter part the same
at 12 o'clock saw the Bahamas keys
So ends the 24 hours

these 24 hours commences with strong winds
from the southward a number of sails in
sight at 4 P.m past gun key lite house
bearing East dist 6 miles middle part strong
winds from the south and squally with latter part
the same saw two sails saw the little bahama
bank So ends the 24 hours

12.00
these 24 hours commences with strong winds
from the south and squally weather and thunder
middle part lite wind from the south
and westward and ragged weather latter
part good weather saw one sail to the south
and east So ends the 24 hours
