these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the  
south and westward at 1 p.m. spoke the schooner primrose  
of nantucket at 4 p.m. saw the brig Elisabeth of westport  
bating middle part strong winds from the south  
and westward and some squally with the latter part  
the same saw four sail to the windward  
So ends these 24 hours

Friday  
the 31  
1840  
these 24 hours Commences with strong winds from the  
south and westward nothing in site of us to day  
squally weather thunder and falling some rain  
middle part lite winds and squally with lightning  
and thunder and rain latter part pleasant weather  
bating in site So ends these 24 hours

Saturday  
the 1  
1840  
these 24 hours Commences with lite winds from  
the south and westward and pleasant four sails  
in site of us at 5 p.m. saw four whales boards  
but did not get fast middle part lite winds from  
the westward and pleasant weather latter part the  
same four sails in site saw grampases  
So ends these 24 hours

Sunday  
the 2  
1840  
these 24 hours Commences with lite winds from the east  
and pleasant weather four sails in site saw grampases  
middle part lite winds from the south and eastward  
and pleasant weather latter part the same one brig  
and two barks in site one barge by lining  
So ends these 24 hours

Monday  
the 3  
1840  
these 24 hours Commences with lite wind from the  
eastward and pleasant with three sails in site saw  
grampases and porpoises middle part lite winds from  
the eastward and pleasant weather latter part the  
same one sail in site saw black fish boards  
the boats but could not get fast to them  
So ends these 24 hours
