the 4
1840
these 24 hours commences with lite winds from the
Eastward and pleasant weather two sails in saw grampuses
middle part lite wind and some squall of rain
later part fine winds from the westward
at 11 am saw sperm whales board the
boats and got nothing so ends these 24 hours

Thursday
the 5
1840
these 24 hours commences with gentle breezes
from the westward blowing whales got fast
and does fast all the after noon got nothing
middle part calm later part squally and
raining saw two sails saw a grampus and porpoises
so ends these 24 hours

Friday
the 6
1840
these 24 hours commences with strong winds from
the Eastward and thick and smoky weather
saw three sails middle part strong winds from
the Eastward later part the same at 11 am
saw sperm whales board the boats and galed them
did not get fast so ends these 24 hours

Saturday
the 7
1840
these 24 hours commences with lite breezes from the
Eastward blowing whales at 3 pm got fast to
two and got one at 4 pm got him along
side and went to cutting at 11 pm got them
middle part lite winds from the Eastward
later part the same all day land in by day
boiling so ends these 24 hours

Sunday
the 8
1840
these 24 hours commences with lite winds from
the Eastward all land in by day in boiling
saw blackfish middle part strong winds from
the Eastward and some rain later part strong winds
from the Eastward and raged saw two sails
at 12 O'clock got them boiling
so ends these 24 hours
