August the 9
1840
these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the Eastward
and raged three sails in site saw breeches of some Linde
middle part strong winds and raged wether latter
part the same all hands imployed in Stowing
down saw four sails two to the windward and two to the
leeward So ends these 24 hours

Sunday
August the 10
1840
these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the
Eastward and raged at 5 pms spoke the barque
Sydney of Rotterdam Capt Rogers at 6 pms got free
Stowing down middle part strong winds from the East
and raged wether latter part the same two bargues
in site So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
August the 11
1840
these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the
Eastward and raged wether nothing in site of us to day
middle part strong winds from the Eastward and
very raged wether latter part the same saw the barke
Hope of Newbedford and squally and raged wether
So ends these 24 hours

Wednesday
August the 12
1840
these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the
Eastward and raged the barque Hope of Newbedford
at 6 pms spoke the back Hope of Newbedford Capt
Davis middle part strong winds from the Eastward and
raged latter part the same the barque Hope in
site of us and nothing else to day
So ends these 24 hours

Thursday
August the 13
1840
these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the
Eastward and raged wether the back Hope in site of us
middle part strong winds from the South and East
and raged wether latter part the same and
squally one sail in site to day of us
So ends these 24 hours
