these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the south and rugged weather middle part strong winds from the south and pleasant weather latter part gentle breezes from the south and pleasant weather one sail in site of us saw grasshoppers So ends these 24 hours

Sunday
August the 16
1840

these 24 hours commences with gentle breezes from the south one sail in site of us to day saw grasshoppers middle part light winds from the south and pleasant weather latter part the same spoke the brig Pickering of Simeon Capt Collins saw the brig Elizabeth of Westport Bay Cook So ends these 24 hours

Monday
August the 17
1840

these 24 hours commences with light winds from the south and very light and pleasant two sails in site of us middle part light wind from the south and westward latter part the same three sails in site of us to day
So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
August the 18
1840

Lat 36. 06
Long 39. 05

these 24 hours commences with light winds from the westward and pleasant weather three sails of us saw grasshoppers middle part light winds from the same spoke the brig Elizabeth of Westport latter part strong winds from the westward saw beaches grasshoppers and sheep So ends these 24 hours

Wednesday
August the 19
1840

Lat 36. 00
Long 38. 38

these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the westward at 2 PM spoke the barque Arab of Fairhaven Capt Widdowson middle part strong winds from the south and westward latter part the same and rainy weather and strong winds and rugged weather nothing in site So ends these 24 hours
