1840 these 24 hours commences with strong winds from
the South and rages all hand employed in clearing
away the whales heads middle part gentle breeze from
the South latter part the same one sail in site of us
all hands employed in boiling out the whales
So ends these 24 hours

Sunday
Sept the 31
1840 these 24 hours commences with lite winds from
the Southward and pleasant employed in boiling
one sail in site middle part lite winds from the
South and Eastward latter part the same employed
in stowing down the oil three sails in site
So ends the 24 hours

Tuesday
Sept the 1
1840 these 24 hours commences with Lite winds from the
South and Eastward and pleasant weather employed
in stowing down the oil three sails in site of us
middle part Lite winds from the South and East
latter part the three sails in site of us to day
at 12 o'clock got three stowing down the oil
So ends these 24 hours

Wednesday
Sept the 2
1840 these 24 hours commences with gentle breeze
from the Eastward and some squally two sails
in site middle part Lite winds from the Eastward
latter part strong winds from the South and Eastward
at 11.30 a.m. saw blackfish heard the boat but
did not get fast So ends these 24 hours

Thursday
Sept the 3
1840 these 24 hours commences with strong winds from the
South and Eastward the bark Champion and the
Elizabeth in site middle part strong winds and
some rain latter part squally weather two sails in
site thick squally weather and some thunder
So ends these 24 hours
