1840 wind all side away and a heavy sea on from the
Eastward middle part lite winds and some squally
latter part strong winds and squally spoke the
+36.00 Elizabeth of westport so ends these 24 hours
39.39

Thursday these 24 hours commences strong winds from the
Westward and squally and ragged one sail in site
1840 middle part lite winds from the North and pleasant
some lite squalls of rain latter part lite winds
from the westward one sail in site to day
+35.24 so ends these 24 hours
39.47

Friday these 24 hours commences with lite winds from the
Westward and pleasant weather one sail in site to
1840 day middle part lite winds from the North
+35.20 and pleasant weather latter part the same
39.50 one sail in so ends these 24 hours

Saturday these 24 hours commences with strong winds
from the South at 4 P.M. saw a sperm whale
1840 board the boat and got me in Co with Capt
Cook of the Elizabeth of westport at 9 P.M.
got him along side middle part strong winds
and squally latter part the same and very
ragged all hands employed in lashing
+35.44 two and plagued badly
39.55 so ends these 24 hours
