Oct the 25
1840
these 24 hours commences with light winds from the north
and pleasant weather middle part strong winds from
the south and eastward latter part the same some
squally at 11 a.m. spoke the schooner, saw a number of
malle heads from our eastern board to savannah
So ends these 24 hours

Monday
Oct the 26
1840
these 24 hours commences with gentle breezes from the
north and thick weather middle part a strong gale
from the north and westward and a very heavy sea on
latter part the wind from the west blowing a heavy
gale and a very bad sea on saw a schooner laying by
So ends these 24 hours

Tuesday
Oct the 27
1840
these 24 hours commences with a strong gale from
the westward and a heavy sea on at 5 p.m. past a schooner
lay by heading to the south middle part a heavy gale
from the north and west and very heavy squalls some
snow latter part good weather wind from the west
saw a number of sails some bound to the north and
some to the south So ends these 24 hours

Wednesday
Oct the 28
1840
these 24 hours commences with gentle breezes from the
north and pleasant weather two sails in sight of us standing
to the north
