 S.B. struck got the rolled the body  
 in let Head go start the works  
 heavy sea running Lat 87-40  
 Lon 10-57

Sat August 27<sup>th</sup>

This day began with light N.E. wind  
 over cast still boiling and staid down  
 Lat 87-25 Lon 10-30

Sun August 28<sup>th</sup>

This day began with light N.E. wind  
 finish boiling and staid down steam  
 & by N by compass Lat 87-40  
 Lon 25-45

Mon August 29<sup>th</sup>

This day began with strong N.E. wind  
 steering S.E. at night hove to under  
 Fayal light House land 4 miles off

Tues August 30<sup>th</sup>

This day began with light S.E. wind  
 later part strong at 4 P.M. anchor  
 at Fayal so this ends this day

From August 31 to Sept 24 discharge oil  
 took water and provision and so on
