

Breeze of Black Eagle. Edwin R. White Master
Wednesday May 23rd 1866.

This day commenced with fresh breezes from the E. N. ship by the wind on different tacks made all sail at 8 A.M. Middle Port much the same at 3 P.M. wind freshened took in the light sails. Latter Part fine weather light winds from E. N. ship too heading E. and S. and sail ends this day.

Thursday May 24th 1866.

This day light cloudy weather and light winds made all sail at daylight. Middle Port much the same. Saw several ships all bound to the Westward. Latter Part fine weather and light winds took in the light sails at dusk. So ends this day.

Commenced with fine weather and fresh breezes from the E. N. ship by the wind made all sail at daylight. Middle Port fine pleasant weather and light winds from the E. N. ship by the wind under the sail. Latter Part fine weather and light winds from E. N. saw several ships. So ends this day.

Friday May 25th 1866.

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather and light winds from the E. N. at daylight made all sail ship by the wind heading E. Broke out water and set up the main Stays. Middle Port fine weather and light winds from the E. N. passed 2 English merchant ships. Latter Part fine weather and calm breeze all the boat to practice. So ends this day.

Bound Towards Hudson Bay Greenland
Sunday May 27th 1866.

This day commenced with calm fine pleasant weather made all sail at daylight. Middle Port fine and light southerly winds steering N. by E. saw a large ship bound to the Westward. Latter Part light winds from E. steering N. by E. So ends this day.

Monday May 28th 1866.

This day commenced with fine weather and light airs from the southward steering N. by E. made all sail at daylight. Middle Port fine weather and light winds from the Southward. Steering N. by E. saw several ships at 4 P.M. gave chase with the Concordia of Sag Harbor. Saw sperm whales this morning watch employed in mending the main sail. Latter Part fine weather and light southerly winds. Took in light sails and courses ends fine.

Tuesday May 29th 1866.

This day commenced with fine weather and light winds from W. made all sail at daylight. Saw several ships. Middle Port fine weather and strong breezes from W. Took in light sails at 2 P.M. double reefed gaud with the Concordia. Latter Part fresh gales from W. N. W. gave ship to under double reef main topsail. Saw a large breck at sundown supposed to be sperm whales. So ends this day.
