

Barge Black Eagle Edwin W. White Master
Saturday Aug. 11th 1866.

This day commenced with strong winds from the Southward Ship by the winds weather being very thick at 4.30 am raised the Cornelia under short sail. Middle Part much the same set the course and kept the Ship N. Latter Part more moderate Saw a sail at dark. Ship by the winds ends with hazy weather and fresh breezes from W. S. E. So ends this day

Sunday Aug. 12th 1866

This day commenced with thick weather and fresh breezes from the Eastward Saw the Glacier of New Bedford Clean had been in the Bay 3 days had seen but one whale. Middle Part weather quite clear and fresh breezes from the Eastward Ship by the winds heading up the Bay come under whole topsails Glacier and Cornelia in Co. Latter Part thick fog and strong breezes from the Southward have the Ship too at dark and double reefed the topsails So ends this day

Monday Aug. 13th 1866

This day commenced with fresh breezes from the Southward and foggy weather. Ship bore too at 2 a.m. winds hauled to the Westward and fog cleared off. Ship by the winds saw the Glacier Middle Part fine weather and fresh breezes from the Westward. Ship by the winds at 4 P.m. Ship off. Paper Breeze. Latter Part light winds from S. E. and dark Cloudy weather. at 10 P.m. passed the mouth of Hagen Straits. ends with fine weather and light air Ship working up Repulse Bay. So ends this day

In Hudsons Bay Greenland
Tuesday Aug. 14th 1866.

This day commenced with fine pleasant weather and light westerly winds all 4 Boats off cruising for whales. Saw one. This day commenced with light winds from the S. W. Ship under full sail working up the Bay Middle Part fine weather and heavy gales from the S. W. and plenty of Ice. Ship working up to Repulse Bay. Ends under short sail in Co with the Glacier and Cornelia. Latter Part heavy gales from S. W. at dark run Ship off and hove too under the lee of Beach Point. So ends

Wednesday Aug. 15th 1866.

This day commenced with fresh gales from the S. W. at daylight made sail working Ship to harbor Middle Part light westerly winds and cloudy weather working Ship up to harbor. Saw 2 Ships in the Harbour. at 1 P.m. came to anchor in Repulse Bay Harbour in commencing into the Harbour the Ship struck on a sunken Rock and stove off some of her splicing from her jib keel. Capt White went out and took in the Glacier. furled all of our sails and 4 Boats went off to cruise for whales. Saw 1 found the Angel Gibbs and Steamer in the Harbour with 4 whales each. So ends this day

Thursday Aug. 16th 1866.

This day fine weather and light winds from the S. W. 3 Boats cruising for whales. Captain went on Board Ship for grub and sail to make a Hunt of no whales seen to day.

Friday Aug. 17th 1866.

This day foggy weather and light breezes from the S. W. Captain returned from the Ship Angel Gibbs got a whale to day So ends this day.
